

CATEGORIES OF MEMBERSHIP

ADULT: One member with full voting rights, eligible for office in the club.

JUNIOR: One member under 18 years with full voting rights and reduced subscription. *Junior membership expires at the end of the 17th year on reaching 18 years of age.*

FAMILY: Up to **two** adults and their children **under 18**, living at one address, first named adult has voting rights, eligible for office. Adult subscription rate and one copy of the magazine *'The Sett'*.

GROUP/UNIT: One named adult contact with voting rights. Adult subscription rate and one copy of the magazine *'The Sett'*.

COMPLETING THE FORM

As members will come into contact with young members of the Scout and Guide movements, we must acknowledge the Child Protection Policies of the movements. This means the Club has to ask for certain information.

All details as appropriate must be completed, including date of birth.

POSITION IN SCOUTING/GUIDING: - Please enter the role you have in the movements at present e.g. the title of the Warrant you hold or Scout Active Support /Fellowship/Trefoil Guild or the lay position you fill.

If you are applying for junior membership, fill in the name of the section you are in.

All these details will be checked.

From early days, members of the Scout and Guide movements have met at camps and Jamborees to foster the spirit of International Scouting and Guiding. Many have swapped badges at these gatherings as permanent memories of the many friends they have made during their time together. Most members of the Movements will have seen at sometime, the very colourful Camp Fire Blankets worn by a great number of people and following this, have been bitten by *"The badge collecting bug"*

In 1955 a club was formed by Ernest Hallett to assist Scouts and Guides in starting and increasing their collection of badges by correspondence and meetings. Today the club has grown to around 1000 members who are spread across over 30 countries.

Membership brings you many new friends both at home and overseas: it opens the door to International Scouting and Guiding: it helps to foster the spirit of friendship throughout the world and your hobby brings you many hours of personal satisfaction.

Membership is open to all members of the Scout and Guide movements, also those who are associated with either movement e.g. Fellowship or Trefoil Guild members or lay members working with either movement.

The club maintains a catalogue of all known badges that are equivalent to, or greater than a UK District and National event badges from all over the world. No campsite or badges of a similar nature are listed.

The Directory of Members lists all current members of the Club throughout the world. The Club magazine, which all members receive, is published six times a year. It includes articles and illustrations of general interest to members, together with swaps and wants adverts, details of meetings, amendments and additions to the catalogue and details of new members. All members are encouraged to write articles or 'Letters to the Editor' for inclusion in the Magazine.

All new members receive a welcome pack including one section of their choice from the catalogue, a copy of the Directory of Members and their first magazine the magazine afterwards being available either by email **OR** hard copy.

To become a member, complete the form inside and return it to the Club Membership Secretary together with the correct fee in the appropriate currency. You can send a cheque, or postal order made out to 'The International Badgers Club'.
